REFLECTION First Sunday of Lent (C)

Jesus went into the desert to be alone and have a quiet time with God. We sometimes have to go away; "far from the madding crowd". Remember, it was not in the earthquake nor in the fire that Elijah experienced God but in the gentle breeze. (1Kgs 19: 12)

Our world is too noisy; we are too preoccupied with the cares and worries of this life that we may not even hear the Lord when he passes by. It was in the silence of the night that young Samuel heard the voice of God call him. (1Sam 3)

Silence is important for our spiritual growth and general wellbeing. The Devil knows it and that is why he doesn't want us to have moments of silence to encounter or experience the presence of God. We are too busy! Work, games, meetings, etc. Create some time in a day, it doesn't have to be a long one, shut everyone and everything out; be alone in prayer with God. Teach your children to value silence. It should not be every minute music, or computer games or face book or social media: No! these do not allow the spirit to grow. This Lent, create some time for silence.


The devil did not go to Jesus on the first day of the fasting and prayer, he went on the last day when he reckoned, he was hungry and weak. Jesus "fasted for forty days and forty nights, after which he was hungry, and the devil came and tempted him." The devil is very clever and cunning. Don't give him any space in your life. Don't underestimate him.

The devil came to Jesus when he believed he would be most vulnerable. But he miscalculated. **Jesus is not Adam**. And what was the first temptation? Food! The devil will never tempt you with what you do not like. He will hit you at your weakest point. It would have been easy for Jesus to use his power to turn stone into bread to eat and take away the hunger. If he did that, he would have put himself under the control of the devil. He refused to use his power for his own comfort.

In this season, temptations will come to you to obey the flesh; to feed the flesh and starve the spirit. When they come, do not be afraid. Run to Jesus. He too experienced temptation. He knows it is not easy. He understands our weakness and can be compassionate. Turn to him in time of temptation; even if we fall, he will in love pick us up and renew us for the journey. The letter to the Hebrews 4: 15-16 assures us,

"We do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathise with our weakness, but one who has similarly been tested in every way, yet without sin. So let us confidently approach the throne...to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help."

Do not be afraid. Open your heart to Jesus. Go to confession this Lent. Go to Mass. Create time for prayers. Read the bible. Go to Jesus in your weakness and helplessness. Remember, he is the one who inspires, he is the one who gives happiness, he is the one who quenches your thirst, he is the one who gives you hope, who gives you true love, who makes life good. He is the one who can raise you up.



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
