# REFLECTION Third Sunday of Lent (C)

In the gospel passage we have the parable of the fig tree that was planted in a vineyard and yet failed to produce fruit. A vineyard was an ideal place for a fig tree to grow and produce. If it failed in a vineyard, then it wouldn't grow or produce any other place. The owner decided to cut it down, but the gardener pleaded with him to give him one more year to dig round it and put manure; and if after all that, it doesn't produce, then he could cut it down.

Jesus in this parable tried to tell the people of Israel that God gave them a choice place and took special care of them, but they failed to bear fruit. Jesus is the gardener who with his life pleads with God to give them more time so that he will preach to them (put manure). Jesus told them that notwithstanding their failure to produce, God will be patient and give them a second chance.

How does this parable apply to us? We are like the people of Israel. God has also given us a choice place in his divine plan. He expects us to bear fruits of love, of patience, kindness, generosity, peace. God in his love and patience has sent his son Jesus, to put manure round us. In our time, Jesus continues the work of tending us through the Church.

God in and through Jesus is giving us time and genuine opportunity to repent. Let us heed the words of St Peter in 2Pet 3: 9, "The Lord is not slow...but is patient toward you, not willing for anyone to perish." And 2Pet 3: 15, "Think of the Lord's patience as your opportunity to be saved."

There is a purpose for every creature. The purpose of the fig tree was to produce fruit, but it failed. What is your purpose? Is it to hate, to kill, and take away hope and joy? Or is it to love and serve and heal and give solace and joy, and mend the broken hearted, and bring peace and hope and light?

Am I achieving my purpose? God is giving us genuine opportunity and time to repent so that we do not perish. God is so patient, so forgiving, so faithful and so loving that he doesn't want any of us to perish. "He does not desire the death of a sinner." (Ezek 33:11) That is why he is patient with us.

Let us raise our voices to God in prayer so that we may hear the Lord say about us as he said of the people of Israel, "I have seen the miserable state of my people.... I have heard their appeal.... I mean to deliver them...." Let us call on him to look with mercy on us and come to save us as he did the people of Israel in their time of affliction.
