REFLECTION, FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (C)

One of the most powerful images in the Bible, in terms of which Jesus describes his relationship with us, is the image of the good shepherd. This image reminds us of the love and care Jesus has for us; his concern that we have the best in every situation and his willingness to go to any length to ensure that we have the best, not minding the cost involved.

There is no genuine love or commitment without sacrifice. The more we love and care for someone the more we are ready to suffer for them. Genuine love and commitment is not a matter of sentiments. Genuine love and commitment can be very costly. When people claim to love and care for us, the love and care is conditional in the sense that they can easily give up if their personal interest is undermined. Very few people will lay down their personal interest in order to care for us.

Yet this is the quality that defines the good shepherd paradigmatically. So, we can understand that when Jesus describes himself as the good shepherd, he is simply telling us that he loves us so much that he will do anything for our sake.

When we think of how much he has invested in order to redeem us, we must be utterly grateful to belong to him. How else can we show our gratitude and appreciation than yielding ourselves to him completely? If he gave himself without reservation in order to save us we too must give ourselves to him completely without holding anything back.

Perhaps, our greatest challenge in this regard is to listen to him and take instructions from him. For unless we listen to him we can hardly discover what he requires of us. But how can we do his will unless we know his will? So, it is very important that we pay attention to him if the huge price he paid for our salvation is to make any real difference in our lives. If we follow him and allow him to direct our course, there is a guarantee that we will not stray but will arrive safely at our destination.

From time to time we must think and meditate upon the love of Jesus for us; for, if the truth must be told, no one can love us as Jesus loves us. If we constantly ponder the love of Jesus for us, the most likely consequence is that we will fall in love with him as well; for, if it dawns on us how much sacrifice he has made on our behalf, we will be lost perpetually in gratitude and appreciation and it is doubtful whether we can ever return the debt. Yet one thing we can do and this would gladden the heart of Jesus is to make it a constant habit to acknowledge what he has done for us. The more we acknowledge his love for us as the good shepherd and think of what he suffered on our behalf, the more our relationship with him will become personal and the more we will come under the influence of his love.
