REFLECTION, FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (C)

The measure of authentic discipleship is love. We cannot genuinely claim to belong to the Lord unless we possess the spirit of love and share his love with others. Perhaps, this is the greatest lesson that Jesus teaches us by the example of his life.

We cannot understand the life and mission of Christ without reference to his love. He himself understood that his vocation was love and love motivated him from start to finish. Not surprisingly, in commissioning his disciples afresh he is not equivocal that their vocation is love as well, for as he says, "a new, commandment I give you, that you love one another even as I have loved you, by this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

If, as he says instructively elsewhere, "a servant is not above his master", then our vocation can be nothing but love, since his life and mission, which we share by virtue of our baptism, is brokered in the crucible of love. His celebrated conversation with Peter after the resurrection makes the point explicit; for, after interrogating him three times consecutively concerning his love, he charged him to feed his sheep. This renewal of Peter's vocation, like all experience of failures when properly utilized, proves to be the tonic that drove Peter to success; for, we know that following his encounter with the risen Lord, Peter found new strength and enthusiasm that drove him to do great things for the Lord.

The same could be said about all the disciples including Paul and Barnabas; for, led by the spirit of God they began to do the very works Jesus did in fulfilment of the master's prophesy that he who believes in me will do the same works that I do, even greater works. They not only worked miracles but like Jesus they suffered a great deal on account of the gospel they preached, but to show they possessed the spirit of Christ they never wavered in the face of persecution but overcame persecution with the energy of love.

Indeed, from what we know from the gospel and the Acts of the Apostles the disciples were true to their mandate and made a success of their vocation. The love that animated their communal life and activity was so evident that people could identify them as followers of Christ, hence they were first called Christians at Antioch. But if they proved so successful in living out their vocation of love it was not because of their power and effort; it was because they were prompted by the spirit and indeed co-operated with the prompting of the spirit; hence the acts of the apostles are correctly designated as the acts of the Holy Spirit.

Like the apostles our vocation too is love. As we receive love and mercy from God we are also expected to offer love and mercy. We must learn to give and share God's love with others without counting the cost. We must learn to release forgiveness to those who hurt us whether they ask it or not. It is by doing this that we prove we are disciples of Christ. Let us open our hearts afresh and ask him to enkindle in us the flame of his love and as he shapes us according to the image of Christ may he transform us into vehicles for transmission of his love and mercy in our milieu and beyond.
