REFLECTION, SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (C)

There is a direct correlation between loving God and keeping his commandments. The only way to show that we truly love him is by keeping his commandments. Love is not a matter of sentiments. It is a matter of commitment and action. Keeping God's commandments may not always be convenient; for to keep God's commandments presupposes certain forgetfulness of self; it presupposes that we love God more than anything else, and indeed more than ourselves. Unless our love of God supersedes self-love or other loves in our lives, we may desire to keep his commandments but fail to find the strength and motivation to rise up to the occasion in the concrete situations of temptations.

Obviously if we are attached to our desire to a point of fault, it will always be difficult to make the sacrifice required to do the will of God. For in those moments of temptation, we will find all kinds of excuses why we must make an exception and satisfy our longing. The truth is that unless we learn to let go of our excessive self-importance on a daily basis, by practicing the discipline of detachment, our desires will always pull us down when God beckons to move in a different direction.

As demanding as it may sometimes be to keep God's commandment, it is actually the best way to preserve our fellowship with him. If we do what he requires of us, it is quite natural that he would be pleased with us; whereas if we choose to disobey him, we are bound to displease him.

Jesus is very clear in the gospel that the only way to remain in God's love and so preserve our communion with him, is by keeping his commandments. Indeed, as he says explicitly, "if a man loves me, he will keep my word, and my father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him."

Nothing is as fulfilling as being in fellowship with God. It is a great blessing indeed to have God dwell in us and with us and to accompany us in our journey through life. When this happens, it means we are never alone as we have God as our partner. This is why Jesus says that if we dwell in communion with God we do not need to be afraid, as God provides for us in every situation and ensures that we are always victorious. To live in union with him, therefore, means that our joy and peace are not tied to external circumstances and for this reason, whatever happens, our joy and peace is intact.

Perhaps this is one of the greatest benefits that accrue from being a disciple of the Lord, for it means that we cannot be ruffled by any situation. Of course, it does not mean we will not experience challenges but because the Lord is with us and provides for us in every situation, challenges are a means through which our fellowship with him is deepened, as he proves to us that he can never let us down no matter how demanding the situation may be.

The basic truth is that the one who dwells in communion with God always has enough to meet the challenges he has to deal with. Yet the secret of remaining in communion with God is keeping his commandments. That is why it is so important that we never joke with God's word if we truly want to make the best of our relationship with him.
