REFLECTION, SOLEMNITY OF PENTECOST

Before the resurrection the disciples were ruled by fear of the Jews. But filled with the Holy Spirit as a result of the Pentecost event they began to preach the gospel boldly without fear or favour. The descent of the spirit on them had such an impact that nothing mattered to them more than making Christ known. Indeed, as a result of their courageous and powerful witness, many were converted to the faith on Pentecost day. Following the Pentecost, they began to preach the gospel in Jerusalem and beyond and made instant gains, despite the fierce persecution they faced.

We cannot explain the success of the early Church without reference to the work of the Holy Spirit. Come to think of it the apostles were uneducated men, so that solely on their own resources they could never have risen up to the occasion resuscitating the mission of Jesus, following his death and resurrection. This is evident from their pre-resurrection situation which depicts them as timid and fearful. Nonetheless, with the coming of the spirit upon them, they are transformed beyond all imagination as they could now confront the authorities boldly, even to the point of telling them to their face that obedience to God is better than obedience to man.

As Jesus once said, he who believes in me will do the works that I do and even greater works. These words were certainly fulfilled in the life of the early church as we can deduce from the miracles they performed. It is not surprising that the nascent church grew from strength to strength, since they were animated by the spirit of Christ, so that what Christ did in his *own* time *and clime*, they too began to do *in their own time and clime* as a result of the influence of the Spirit.

We must understand that if we have the Spirit of Christ, there is no need for us to be afraid of challenges. If the Spirit animates us and leads us into every occasion and situation, no situation or occasion can overwhelm us, for the very challenges we go through become the means through which God reveals his glory in our lives and takes us to the next level. That indeed is the story of the early Church. It is the story of the Church all through its history. The promise of Jesus is that he will be with the Church forever and the gate of hell shall never prevail against it. That promise is valid and that is why we can see that despite all the challenges that face the Church, the Church continues to wax stronger. Indeed, the various crises that the Church suffers, turn out to be a means through which God purifies the Church and makes the Church more resourceful in assuming her mission of witnessing to Christ in the world.

The Church began on a note of uncertainty but through the power and action of the Holy Spirit, it has grown into a massive phenomenon like the mustard seed. Consequently, as we celebrate the birthday of the Church today and indeed our own birthday, let us pray for greater awareness of the presence of the Holy Spirit in the Church and in our lives as well as the grace to always co-operate with the spirit, so that we can live a life that conforms to the life of Christ.
