# REFLECTION, TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY (C)

Anything worthwhile in life comes at a cost; no true success comes without sacrifice and commitment. This is very true of discipleship, our whole effort to follow Christ. It is not without condition, so that we cannot hope to succeed unless we pay the price. It is not surprising therefore, that Jesus takes care in the gospel to lay down the cost of discipleship. As he says explicitly: "If any man comes to me without hating his father, mother, wife, children, brothers, sisters, yes and his own life too, he cannot be my disciple. Anyone who does not carry his cross and come after me cannot be my disciple."

How can Jesus require us to hate rather than love? Is he not contradicting himself? How can he ask us to hate our loved ones who deserve our affection and care? Let us note that Jesus is not speaking literally here. The word "hate" as used in this context is the Semitic expression for "loveless". Understood in this sense, Jesus is not asking us to hate our loved ones in the literal sense. On the contrary, Jesus is actually saying we cannot love him less than our father, mother, wife, children, sisters and even the self. If we love him less than any of these, then we cannot be his disciples.

The point of Jesus, in other words, is that we cannot love anyone or anything more than we love him, if we truly claim to be his disciple. Not only must our love of him be primary, it must also supersede every other love such that no other love is in competition with the love of Christ. But, on the contrary, all other loves are subordinate to the love of Christ. We must love them less than Jesus. Yet if we must love our loved ones "less' than Jesus, rather than more than Jesus, we must be imbued with the spirit of detachment, as it enables us to prefer Christ to any other person or thing.

The basic truth is, that without the spirit of detachment, we cannot love God in all things and above all things. For it is detachment that enables us to let go of things and persons in moments of conflict and let God have his due place in our lives.

Clearly, therefore, discipleship is not a matter of sentiments but rather a matter of sacrifice and commitment; we cannot undertake the task of discipleship successfully without considering what is involved and whether we are prepared to pay the price. When we think through what is involved, we are more likely to succeed than when we rush into it without proper consideration. The question is: how much of God's love is there in my life? Are there persons or things that I treasure more than God, persons or things that take up the primary place of God in my life? Lord, help me to love you in all things and above all things.
