

REFLECTION, THE EXALTATION OF THE CROSS

The three Parables in today's gospel clearly illustrate the infinite worth of the sinner and the fact that on the part of God no sacrifice is too much in order to save the sinner otherwise how else do we account for the fact that a man with a hundred sheep will leave ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the missing one? The huge risk involved here is incalculable and from the standpoint of sound economics, it is not worth it.

Instructively, the same extravagance we witness on the part of the shepherd, in relentlessly pursuing and recovering the lost sheep, recurs in the parables of the lost coin and the prodigal son. In respect of the lost coin, the woman temporarily shifts her focus away from the nine out the ten coins and proceeds as if the lost coin was the only coin she had. But in the end her huge sacrifice is rewarded as she finds the lost coin, with the development provoking a celebration with his neighbours. In the parable of the prodigal son, the extravagance assumes the form of relentlessly wishing the return of the son, despite his misbehaviour, to the point that the father was almost looking out every day to see whether the departed son was returning. It is easy to underestimate the import of this looking out unless we understand the huge emotional resources it involved. It is more or less an indication that the father was no longer himself without his son. Once his son had departed, he became restless and all the time his thoughts were on him. True he did not quite set out to search for him. Yet the longing for his return was already a form of a search and the huge resources expended in this emotional longing cannot be underestimated.

What is evident therefore is this: whether it is the parable of the lost sheep, or the parable of the lost coin, or the parable of the prodigal son, the message is the simple one that the sinner is precious to God. Despite the pains our sins cause God, God is relentless in his effort to save the sinner from self-destruction and the recovery of the sinner is always a moment of celebration in the divine court. Perhaps, the greatest challenge that God's attitude to the sinner confronts us with, is the need never to write anyone off or ourselves. We should never give up on anyone nor give up on ourselves no matter how hopeless we might think the situation is.

If we understand that God never gives up on anyone but is prepared to stake everything as the parable of the lost sheep indicates, we will never despair of God's love. No matter what we have done or how grave our failing may be, we will understand that God is always there for us; God never shuts the door against us, but always leaves it open, thus allowing the possibility of our return. But more than just allowing for the possibility of our return he is also expecting us to return as the parable of the prodigal son indicates. It is one thing to leave the door open, it is another thing to expect our return. Expecting our return involves a more active engagement and that is what we see in God's attitude to the sinner. If we understand that God not only keeps the door open but actively longs for our return, we should not delay in returning to his love once we realize we have departed from the path of righteousness.

The point is, if we realize how much God loves us, we shall be quick to return to his love: memories of his immense love for us will also lead us to hate to offend him. Love is the cure for disobedience. If his love really dwells in our hearts, his love should move us to prefer him to self and indeed to every other thing.
