REFLECTION, TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY (C)

Without faith we cannot make the best of life's challenges. Like many things in life, while it is important to have faith and put our faith into action in grappling with the challenges of life, the most important thing is not how much faith we have, but that we put our faith into action, whether it is big or small.

Sometimes the problem is that we are so overwhelmed by the challenges of life that we do not remember to exercise our faith; in moments of crisis or trials, we find it difficult to pray. Of course, if our faith is active, it will sustain us in such moments and enable us to maintain our communion with God. In difficult moments, it is crucially important to keep our focus on Christ. If our focus is on him, he will grant us wisdom, inspiration and motivation, not only to understand our situation in his light but also the courage and strength to act appropriately.

The basic truth is, unless we exercise our faith, we cannot get hold of the situation. That is why when the disciples asked Jesus to increase their faith, he did not say he will not increase their faith but rather he went straight to the crucial issue of the need to put our faith in action and the amazing result that comes from doing so. In his words, "If you had faith as a grain of mustard seed, you could say to this sycamore tree, be rooted up and be planted in the sea and it would obey you."

Of course, it is one thing to have faith, it is another thing to exercise it. A faith that is not applied in concrete situations of life, is like money which lies in a bank account and not used to solve concrete problems. The essence of money is to be used to solve problems. So too is faith. Faith should help us to deal with challenges of life and so experience the power of God's providence in our lives. But if faith is not put into action, it loses its credit. That is why the emphasis of Jesus is that "if you could say to this tree be uprooted and be planted in the sea it will obey you." This is the active mood and not passive mood. If our faith is to secure results for us we must be proactive in applying it to the situations that trouble us.

When we exercise our faith, we express our trust in God that he will not let us down. If God is with us and guides us in our steps there is no need for us to fret in the face of the challenges of life. If we have faith in God and put our faith in action, our faith should give us confidence to undertake what we have to undertake, believing that God provides for us and his providence is sufficient and superior to meet the demands of any situation, no matter the particulars of such situation. Lord, teach us to put to maximum use the little faith we have and may this serve to grant us victory over all obstacles in our lives.
