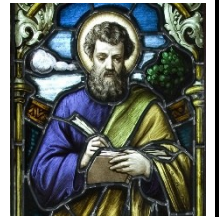
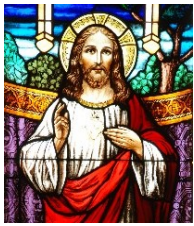

## REFLECTION, Fourth Sunday of Advent (A)

We are reminded today of the need to always say yes to God even when we do not understand his plans for us. No matter how inadequate we feel about ourselves we should never ever say No to God. It is important to trust God and abandon ourselves to his providence. If we are truly open to the grace of God and desire to do his will, God will empower us to let go and accept his invitation.

Mary's initial response to God's invitation to be the mother of the saviour was one of confusion. She could not see herself in the light the angel cast her. The angel sensed her confusion and sought to diffuse this by casting light on how it was going to happen. She took time to explain to Mary, that although she was a virgin this will not constitute any obstacle in realization of God's plan, since the child will be conceived through the power of the Holy Spirit. To encourage her to accept the offer and yield herself to this project, the angel presented for her consideration the case of her cousin Elizabeth who was well known to be barren. The angel impressed it on Mary's mind that through divine intervention she has since conceived and is in her sixth month of pregnancy.

The care the angel took to explain to Mary and secure her consent to this divine plan tells us how God treats us. Even though he is our creator he treats us with respect and never forces us to do anything, realizing that there is no value in any service that is not undertaken freely. Thus, the angel will not coerce Mary into accepting the invitation. He will leave Mary the space to consider the matter herself and make up her mind. Once she has completed her explanations, presenting her with all the elements she needed to make up her mind, the angel would leave her to respond.

This moment of waiting for Mary was a painful one, since, as a consequence of her freedom she could turn down the offer or accept the offer. She was not under any compulsion to accept. But the expectation of the angel and the entire heavenly court was that Mary will accept. Indeed, after some moments, Mary's answer came forth and, quite gratifyingly, it was affirmative, as she said in response to the invitation, "I am the handmaid of the Lord, let it be done to me according to your word." Mary's declaration of her consent here has been understood as the acme of the expression of her faith in divine providence.

The great lesson we must learn from the annunciation event, especially Mary's reception of the angel's message, is the need to be generous in giving ourselves to the service of God. No matter the difficulties involved, it is better to say yes to God. Saying yes to him concretely demonstrates our love for him, making it clear that we prefer his will even to our will. As we eagerly await the birth of our Saviour, let us be guided by the example of Mary's faith. Let us make her Yes, our Yes by letting go and letting God. The saviour wants to be born afresh in our hearts and rule over us, let us ask him to come and make his home in us. If, like Mary, we unite ourselves with the mysterious will of God, the word incarnate will come to dwell in us and fill us with his joy and peace. Nothing is as wonderful as having God to dwell with us
